



## **CBS LAW DEPARTMENT IN-HOUSE INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCE**

The CBS Law Department is committed to creating and participating in programs designed to assist law students from all backgrounds in obtaining the training, development, and advancement opportunities necessary to succeed in the legal profession. To that end, the CBS Law Department has developed the In-House Internship Experience with the goal of providing substantive experience and meaningful exposure to law students interested in learning about in-house practice. CBS encourages diverse law students to apply and defines diversity broadly to include not only its most “visible” aspects such as race and gender, but all of its aspects, such as age, physical disability, sexual orientation, religion, national origin, and marital/parental status.

The In-House Internship Experience is designed to provide students with the opportunity to be exposed to the various legal issues handled by in-house attorneys from across the Company. During the course of the internship, participants should expect to interact with attorneys handling matters pertaining to CBS’s various business entities, such as CBS Television, CBS News, CBS Interactive, Simon & Schuster, and Showtime. Students should also expect to be exposed to several different practice areas while working under the supervision of attorneys from the Law Department’s Intellectual Property, Labor and Employment, Corporate, and Litigation practice groups. Participants will be invited to join CBS attorneys in attending seminars on various legal issues in the media field, and luncheons with CBS attorneys will be arranged allowing CBS attorneys to discuss their careers and to answer student questions in an informal setting.

The In-House Internship Experience is open to students who will be 2Ls and 3Ls at the time of the internship and will take place during the summer. The internship is unpaid and students will be required to receive academic credit from their law school for their participation in the internship. Students should expect to spend at least 20 hours per week at CBS, subject to any requirements of their law school. Prior experience in media is not required.
