The Honorable Johnnie B. Rawlinson

THE NINTH CIRCUIT

The Honorable Johnnie B. Rawlinson was appointed to the U.S. Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in 2000. She is also the first African-American woman to serve on that court. Rawlinson served as a U.S. District Judge, District of Nevada, for only two years before being nominated to the nation's second-highest court by President Bill Clinton. Prior to her judicial service, she spent 18 years with the Office of District Attorney, Clark County, Nevada. She rose from deputy district attorney to chief deputy district attorney to assistant district attorney, where she supervised civil, family support and administrative divisions from 1995 to 1998. A North Carolina native, Rawlinson maintains her chambers in Las Vegas where she has spent her entire legal career. Rawlinson received her bachelor's degree (summa cum laude) at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University and graduated with distinction from the McGeorge School of Law at the University of the Pacific receiving her Juris Doctor.

The Honorable Leslie Emi Kobayashi

UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT FOR THE DISTRICT OF HAWAII

The Honorable Leslie Emi Kobayashi serves as a United States district judge for the United States District Court for the District of Hawaii. She was nominated by President Barack Obama on April 21, 2010, was confirmed by the Senate on December 18, 2010, and received commission on December 22, 2010. Prior to her appointment to the U.S. District Court, Kobayashi worked as a trial attorney and managing partner of the law firm of Fujiyama, Duffy & Fujiyama for 17 years. She worked as a deputy prosecuting attorney in Honolulu before becoming a United States magistrate judge on August 2, 1999. She is a member of the America Inn of Court and the American Judicature Society. Kobayashi has also served as an adjunct professor at the William S. Richardson School of Law. Kobayashi received her Bachelor of Arts from Wellesley College and her Juris Doctor from the Boston College Law School.

THE HONORABLE ANN CLAIRE WILLIAMS

U.S. COURT OF APPEALS FOR THE SEVENTH CIRCUIT

The Honorable Ann Claire Williams was nominated to the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit by President William Jefferson Clinton and was confirmed on November 10, 1999. She became the first African-American ever appointed to the Circuit and the third African-American woman to serve on any federal appeals court. Previously, she was appointed by President Ronald Reagan, at the age of 35, to an Article III federal judgeship.
